CCCW runs an annual residential Summer Institute on 'World Christianity and Global Challenges' in Cambridge.

It is a wonderful opportunity for Christians to gather together to learn about Christianity in other parts of the world. It is also an opportunity to build relationships as global Christians.

Each year the Institute will deal with a challenge focusing on the following questions:

**Impacts:** How does the challenge affect Christians locally and globally? How does it impact societies?

**Responses:** The various ways in which Christians and Christian communities respond to it; the strengths and shortcomings of the responses.

**Actions:** What insights can Christians from different parts of the world learn from each other? How can these shape Christian mission, ministry and education in each one's local context? In what ways can Christians as a global community, with our neighbours from other faiths and traditions, work together to create better societies?




