Collections, mainly of printed papers, of Dr Ralph Leech (1911-2011) and Mrs Bertha Leech (d.2006), medical missionaries in East Africa

About 500 items, 1939-2006

Catalogued with these papers is the recording of an interview made with Dr Leech by Graham Kings (LEE 22), two sketches which were either overlooked in the original catalogue or received with artifact collection in July 1997 (LEE 23) and an address definitely received with one of those items (LEE 24). A record of the artifact collection is being compiled.

Dr Ralph Bosdin Leech was a Cambridge graduate who worked in the Church Missionary Society Hospitals at Mengo, Uganda, 1938-46, and at Maseno, Kenya, 1947-62, prior to appointment as Medical Officer for Uganda, which office he held until 1964. Biographical information obtained at time of deposit is slender, but he was evidently born in Nungumbankum, Madras [now usually Nungambakkam, Chennai], the second son of Arthur John Leech (1873-1940) CIE [Companion of the Order of the Indian Empire] MBE a merchant from Manchester, son of Sir Bosdin Thomas Leech (notable promoter of the Ship Canal) and Louise Rohde, his second wife [www.gatheringthethreads.co.uk and family information; correspondence in Cheethams Library Manchester]. The Rugby School Register 1911-46 and Rugby Who's Who confirm this and gives his parents address as The Palms, Madras. He was admitted to Rugby in 1925, left in 1929 on following in the steps of his notable medical uncle Ernest

Bosdin Leech to Christ's College Cambridge, taking the Natural Sciences tripos in 1931 before clinical training at the London Hospital (MRCS LRCP 1935, MB ChB (Cantab, 1938)). It seems likely his conversion to the CMS cause dates from his days at Cambridge.

Dr Leech met Bertha Jackson at a missionary training course in Malvern, and they were marrie in 1938, shortly before their posting to the CMS Hospital at Mengo, Uganda, situated on the outskirts of Kampala. Dr Leech's appointment indeed provides a link to the pioneering age at Mengo of Sir Albert Cook, with whom he is shown in a photograph of 'Hospital Staff, Past and Present' in 1938, the year of his arrival. He was there till March 1946. After furlough in England, but including active involvement in evangelical work, he returned to East Africa to work at Maseno Hospital, Kisumu, Kenya on the edge of Lake Victoria, remaining there through the period of the Mau Mau insurgency and Kenya independence until 1964.

The Leeches were of course in contact with other CMS missionaries, particularly with Joe Church and Bill Butler when in Uganda, and with African evangelists, notably Simeon Nsibambi, and were supportive but not uncritical. Online material has referred to his view of the East African Revival at least occasionally providing 'a front for disgruntled members seeking attention' (letter to Archbishop Beecher 1955 cited in MW Gachihi's Nairobi 2014 PhD thesis 'Faith and Nationalism: Mau Mau and Christianity in Kikuyuland'; cf. Peterson's *Ethnic Patriotism and the East African Revival*, p.146n) but the allusion is to a particular group and probably uncharacteristic.

Bertha Jackson had a very different background. Her parents were from Belfast but had come to England where her father founded the Letchworth Garden City Laundry in the very early days of the new town². The family was involved with the Anglican St Paul's church in the town, but it was through reading Hudson Taylor that Bertha at the age 16 felt a strong call to missionary service, and it was evidently with this in mind that she trained as a nurse at St Bartholomew's Hospital, London, in 1934-38.

It is unclear if Mrs Leech was appointed to a nursing position at Mengo simultaneously to her husband, but with pregnancy and four children (Jane, Stephen, Mary, John) born during their Uganda years 1939-46 her continuous nursing work must have come to an end, helping only when the hospital was short-staffed, apart from running a baby clinic at Mengo. Two further children (Ruth, Sally) were born in Kenya later. Her quiet-time book however demonstrates she was fully involved with evangelistic work, talking to Mothers' Union meetings, etc., which developed further when they returned to

Africa in 1947, with Jane staying in the U.K. at Coldeast Colony, (Hants.) and the other children eventually away during term at boarding school.

The Leeches returned from Africa in 1964, to Lymington, Hants., where Ralph went into general practice and also acted as a Church of England lay reader. Bertha died in August 2006, Ralph in June 2011.

During years in Uganda and Kenya the Leeches developed a keen interest in African culture and built up a collection of local items which was donated to the Centre the year after the second instalment of this archive material (Acc 19/14). A separate list of these is available.

In 1952 with Bertha Leech he organised the Maseno Convention (see JEC 2/8-9); in 1955 he was appointed one of four African assistant bishops, being consecrated by Archbishop Fisher, in 1960, subsequently becoming Bishop of Maseno, and in 1974, upon Leonard Beecher taking slightly early retirement with the coming independence of Kenya, simultaneously the first indigenous Bishop of Nairobi and Archbishop of the new Anglican Province of Kenya, occupying that role until 1980.
